Garden Dinner Party Recap:

- Some guests said it was the best year yet, and that every year it gets better
- The house that hosted 2 sets of guests was not ideal.
- A positive note is that there were no expenses at Caroline's gathering, as the apps and the wine were donated.
- A note to make for next year would be to move the wine table further away, as it was a crowded situation.
- One of the houses had hosts that continued pouring wine, maybe next year, have a cap on how much alcohol is consumed at the houses.
- Without postage costs, the event brought in \$12,019. The guests themselves brought in \$5,970.
 Sponsors brought in \$2,500. The rest of the funds were donations. Next year the cost of the dinner will be raised to \$100. Sponsorship will begin earlier next year.
- The committee will make an effort to involve younger hosts for next year's dinner party. One idea is to invite them to the GDP so that they have an idea of what is involved.

GRANTS

- <u>Community Foundation</u>: received a \$3,000 grant. Green giving invited the Center to apply for a \$1,000 grant. If it is received, Caroline will apply it to the air conditioner expense.
- Hits that the center has incurred are a bill for the air conditioner, \$9,600, and the Community Foundation cannot give out their \$15,000 due to the loan on the land for the new center.
- Caroline was hoping to work with the village on receiving some money but no one is returning phone calls.
